THE INTRODUCTION OF THE BUILDING CODE OF AUSTRALIA (BCA) AND THE DISABILITY STANDARDS (PREMISES STANDARDS),

AS1428 was developed to ensure

- 1. CONTINUOUS ACCESSIBLE PATHS OF TRAVEL AND CIRCULATION SPACES FOR PEOPLE WHO USE WHEELCHAIRS:
- 2. ACCESS AND FACILITIES FOR PEOPLE WITH AMBULATORY DISABILITIES; AND
- 3. ACCESS FOR PEOPLE WITH SENSORY DISABILITIES.




THESE STANDARDS TRULY ARE THE MINIMUM

One member of the discussion, who works at a major rural hospital in the Northern Rivers, commented on new renovations that were completed on her ward in 2022. Whilst the hospital was aesthetically contemporary & clean, the distance between permanent beds and walls, whilst meeting the minimum standards as outlined in AS1428, were unable to move the hospitals standard wheelchairs.

Observation of this space saw a regular, but quiet, flow of pedestrians. This is an attractive aspect of the space when considering our intended audience & stakeholders.

This site also sees a beautiful, natural light, removing the necessity for excessive electrical work for the project as lighting is able to be exclusively provided with LED, remote-controlled lighting components. The exposed & open ceiling design allows for this.








MONTE LUPO ARTS

FLOORPLANS




CEILING PLAN 1:50

The intention of the sheer, linen canopies is to communicate the flexibility that is a necessity for disabilities and therefore accessibility; the difference in colour and tension applied communicate this concept.

Due to the utilisation of natural light within the site, the use of a bright yellow sheer fabric above the space allocated for discussion and communication highlights the seating and therefore draws people in.

This is a core intention of the installation; communication & discussion.




Multiple images are layered over the floor area of this installation, whilst also incorporating different techniques of wayfinding and guidance.

To highlight AS 1428 minimum standards, diagrams are engraved on the floor below to educate the audience about the different ways these requirements can be utilised to **inspire fluidity rather than restrict it.**

LED's are utilised to promote wayfinding through a creative source. The intention of this installation is to inspire designers and the community to incorporate accessibility necessities in a fun and aesthetic way to promote the use of them, rather than the current avoidant attitude.

CONTINUOUS ACCESSIBLE PATHS OF TRAVEL



APPLICATION OF THE AUSTRALIAN STANDARDS WERE EXPLORED BY DYNAMICALLY ADJUSTING THE AVERAGE RESPONSE TO THE STANDARDS.

AS1428.6 GAVE DIRECT OUTLINES OF THE SPACE REQUIRED. BY INSERTING THESE IMAGES ON THE FLOOR, ONE CAN GATHER AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE SPACE OFFERED AS A MINIMUM, IN COMPARISON TO THE SPACE THAT COULD BE AFFORDED IF ACCESSIBILITY WAS CELEBRATED.

AS1428.8 SIGNAGE WAS A CORE ASPECT THAT WAS RE-EVALUATED. A FLUID PATTERN IS EXPLORED TO DIRECT AND ENCOURAGE INDIVIDUALS TO EXPLORE THE SPACE.

SIMILARLY, AS1428.18 ASSEMBLY BUILDINGS STANDARD PUSHED DESIGNERS TO RESTRICT WHEELCHAIR SEATING TO THE BACK OF AUDITORIUM, THEATRES, ETC. DUE TO THE SPACE REQUIRED FOR SAFE MOVEMENT. REINTERPRETATION OF THIS STANDARD HAS SEEN THE MOVEMENT OF THESE SEATS INTO THE CENTRE OF THE DISCUSSION SPACE, FURTHERMORE PUSHING THE CONVERSATION TOWARDS EXPERIENCE RATHER THAN OBSERVATION.


SECTIONS & ELEVATIONS

The materiality of this space accentuates that these standards are not limitations, but rather something that can be embraced




It's not enough to simply follow these guidlines, we must embrace them to extend our designs.





The storefont is continuously open to allow for audience members to appreciate the installation even when the store is closedd. All stock and storage space is located within the seats that lift to reveal box storage below.



Textured LED strip channels are utilised to create

fluid wayfinding that is visually accessible from all


points of the installation.

TGI's are also located around the boundary of the installation to signal a hazard (slight decline)

Texture's allow for compliance with AS1428.9 9 Tactile Ground Surface Indicators (TGSIs).

Installation is elevated only 50mm off of original flooring of the Watermall. A smooth transition is created to comply with AS1428.7.2 Construction Tolerances for Abutment of Surfaces


